“The Forgotten Peace Process: The Impact of the ‘New’ Middle East on Israeli Politics”:

The lecture deals with the reasons why the Israeli-Palestinian peace process has been broken, frozen and, indeed, disappeared from the political agenda in Israel over the last several years. Also, we will analyze which political forces benefit from this situation and thus want to maintain it, notwithstanding the serious risks Israel may suffer regarding its international standing.

Prof Dr Dan Korn has been a lecturer in Political Science and Public Policy at Israeli universities and at various European universities such as LSE, Bucharest, Potsdam and Munich. He served as a member of the 16th Knesset (the Israeli Parliament). Current and previous assignments include the Presidency of the World Federation of Bessarabian Jews, Presidency of the Israeli LSE Alumni Association, Chairmanship of the Israeli Federation of Trade and membership in the Olympic Committee of Israel. Dan Korn authored several books on public policy, political parties, national unity governments and coalition politics. He has been a TV and radio analyst and commentator for more than three decades.
